Controlled Substance Disposal

Issue:

The storage of controlled substances awaiting destruction can create vulnerability within the controlled substance life cycle.

Background:

- New technology has made the necessity for waiting to destroy controlled substances obsolete, allowing for real-time destruction that meets both chain-of-custody and environmental standards.
- When medications needing to be destroyed are not stockpiled, it improves security and decreases opportunity for diversion.

Recommendations:

- 1. If the facility destroys multiple doses of controlled substances at one time, it does so in a way that two individuals in a facility are not the only people involved in CS destruction over time. Including additional individuals removes opportunity for diversion/collusion.
- 2. The facility invests in a medication disposal system that meets DEA, EPA, and Pollution Control Agency requirements (Such as MedSafe or Cactus Sinks).
